



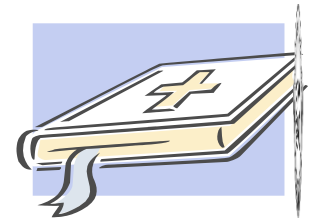

PUBLIC MASSES: We welcome the return of public Masses. Once again it will be a very different experience to attend Mass with smaller numbers and social distancing. We ask for your understanding and patience as we put safety measures in place. Some people may not feel comfortable in attending Mass. The obligation to attend Mass on Sundays continues to be lifted.

Mass will be celebrated each day from Monday to Saturday at 9.30am. Weekend Masses on Saturday at 6.30pm and Sunday at 10am, 11.15am & 12.30pm. There will not be a booking system, just first come, first served. We encourage people to observe all the safety protocols.
