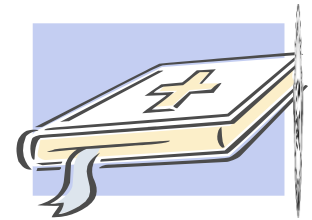

**PUBLIC MASSES:** We welcome the recent announcement that we can have 100% capacity at all Masses. As more people return to Mass, we encourage all people to be mindful of people who are just returning to Mass after many months. Please wear a mask in the church.

1. All doors will be in use.
2. Please use the sanitizers as you enter the church.
3. The collection boxes inside the doors will continue to be used instead of having an Offertory Collection.
4. We encourage people to come forward for Holy Communion row-by-row and to receive on the hand only.
5. The Family Chapel is also open for use.

Mass each day, Monday to Saturday at 9.30am. Weekend Masses on Saturday at 6.30pm and Sunday at 10am, 11.15am & 12.30pm.

**RADIO KERRY:** Our regular Parish Mass on Sundays at 10am, will be broadcast live.

**PARISH OFFICE:** is open from 9.00am –12.30pm.

**MISSION SUNDAY:** The annual Mission collection is held worldwide to support the work of missionaries in poor and remote communities; such as helping build vital infrastructure, churches, medical clinics and schools. We also remember the work of Irish missionaries over the years. The collection will take place next weekend (October 30th /31st). Many thanks for your generous support.

**TOGETHER AGAIN SUNDAY;** will be celebrated on October 30th/31st. It will mark the return to parish Masses and parish activities in a safe way, after all the restrictions. People are invited to return to Mass and to gather as a parish community.

**NOVEMBER ENVELOPES:** The envelopes for the November lists and the November prayer card have been distributed to all households in the Parish at present. If you want to include anyone in the Friday evening Mass who died outside the parish since last year, please write their names on an envelope and return it to the letterbox at the Parish Office by Tuesday November 9th.
