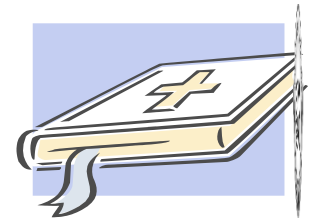

**LISTELICK SCHOOL BUILDING:** We wish to inform you, that all going well, the new school in Listellick is due to open towards the end of October or early November of this year. Following consultation with the Diocesan Property Office, we intend offering this building for lease to interested parties either in whole or in part.

To this end, any party interested in taking a lease of the current school building or a part of the building should in the first instance submit a written expression of interest, made by post, and addressed to the Diocesan Property Office, Cathedral Walk, Killarney, Co. Kerry, V93 Y624 to be received no later than close of business on Monday, July 11<sup>th</sup>, 2022. Any expression of interest received after that date will not be considered. The lease will be subject to a number of terms and conditions and the successful applicant will be required to furnish written confirmation that there is public liability insurance in place and will also be responsible for the upkeep and maintenance of the property. Further information will issue to all parties that submit an expression of interest.
