



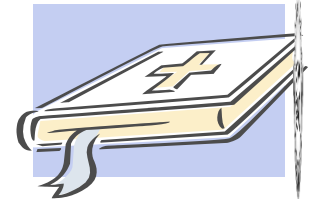

INTRODUCTION TO THE READINGS THIS WEEKEND

First Reading: Peter stresses that he and his companions were witnesses to the ministry of Jesus, as well as his death and resurrection. Now they are being sent out to proclaim the Risen Lord.
